The Board of Commissioners met in regular session with Commissioner Kathy M Luthi, Commissioner James P Kay, Commissioner Ray McGavran, and Mary Arganbright, County Clerk.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman McGavran.

The official minutes of June 29, 2009, were approved and signed.

Sandy Cline, and Deana Sanchez, Health/Aging Department, discussed credit card bills and late charges. After discussion, Sandy turned her credit card in.

Commissioner Kay seconded. Motion carried. After placing a call to Jo Funk, Saline County Sanitarian, Commissioner Luthi moved to pay \$4,188.50, for services July 1, 2009-December 31, 2009. The prior motion pertains to fiscal year January 1, 2010-December 31, 2010. Commissioner Kay seconded. Motion carried. The commissioners instructed Jo Funk that Ottawa County wanted to double the fees for environmental services. Jo will contact the other counties to see what they were thinking.
