The Board of Commissioners met in regular session with Commissioner James P Kay, Commissioner Kathy M Luthi, Commissioner Karen Brumbaugh, and County Clerk Mary Arganbright.

Commissioner Kay opened the meeting in the flag salute and prayer.

Vouchers were approved.

June 17, 2013, the commissioners signed a letter to Kansas Attorney General Derek Schmidt exempting Ottawa County buildings from the requirements of Senate Substitute for House Bill 2052 on the conceal carry law.

Doug McKinney, North Central Kansas Regional Planning Commission, gave the commissioners a cost benefit analysis of the Grain Belt Express Clean Line LLC for Ottawa County. He also updated the board on projects in the county.

Jason Parks, County Attorney, and Amber Phipps, met with the board and the group discussed the future of the Health Department. The commissioners will pull some information together and get back with Amber.

Paul Burger, Burger Farms, stopped in and discussed closing a road in Bennington Township, Section 31. He asked if he needed to get a survey done or not, as he is being told two different things. The commissioners will talk to the Appraiser's office on some information and get back with him.
