

The Board of Commissioners met in regular session with Commissioner Kathy M. Luthi, Commissioner Ray McGavran, Commissioner Harold McCullick, and County Clerk Mary Arganbright.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman McCullick.

The official minutes of March 13, 2006, were read, approved, and signed.

LeRoy Windhorst, Wells, stopped in and asked if Wells could get a couple of signs that says Wells. The commissioners said they didn't see why not.

Bruce Barefield, County Attorney, reported on juvenile detention meeting he attended last week. He gave the board the annual statistics for 2005.

Jettie Condray, Museum Curator, gave a report on the Museum.
