Commissioner McGavran moved to approve the plan. Commissioner Luthi seconded. Motion carried. Annie talked to the board about the budgeted line items for 2011 that they had to transfer within their budget. Commissioner McGavran moved to approve the transfer within the budget. Commissioner Luthi seconded. Motion carried. Commissioner Luthi seconded. Motion carried. Commissioner Luthi seconded. Motion carried.

Keith Coleman, Sheriff, gave prisoner count of Sedgwick County 27, Ottawa County 3, and Cloud County 1. Keith reported that prisoners from KDOC should be coming in.

Judge Thrower stopped in and the commissioners talked to her about going back on the Community Corrections board. Judge Thrower said she would. Commissioner McGavran moved to appoint Judge Thrower to the advisory board of Community Corrections. Commissioner Luthi seconded. Motion carried.
