

The Board of Commissioners met in regular session with Commissioner James P Kay, Commissioner Kathy M Luthi, Commissioner Karen Brumbaugh, and County Clerk Mary Arganbright.

Commissioner Kay opened the meeting in the flag salute and prayer.

Larry Sharp, KCAMP, the county's liability insurance company, gave the commissioners an update on insurance.

John Copple, Highway Administrator, reported on what crews were doing. John gave the commissioners a Solid Waste Fee Exemption from Delphos Coop, which was approved. John said they were done chip sealing, and they will start fog sealing tomorrow. Several road and bridge issues were discussed.

Kenny Baccus, Noxious Weed Administrator, visited with the commissioners and said that the plumbing and electrical has been finished on the new building. The drywall has been subcontracted out. Kenny said that things are getting done. Kenny said that he had to buy chemical last week. Kenny said that the NAISMA conference this year is in Jackson Hole, Wyoming. He is a board member. He said that his budget is tight. He will have to pay for flight, and some other expenses. Some expense might be reimbursed. The commissioners asked for Kenny to see about the reimbursement for sure and get back with them.

Prisoner count was reported of Sedgwick County 50, City of Minneapolis 1, Ottawa County 1, and Saline County 4.

Jason Parks, County Attorney, stopped in and the commissioners asked about several HIPPA updates and deadlines approaching. The group discussed the conceal carry law.

Max Adkins, visited with the commissioners about bindweed in the ditches of the county. Commissioner Kay said that they are out spraying now and with as wet as it has been it's a problem. Max said that he has asked Kenny Baccus, Noxious Weed Administrator, twice to come spray. Commissioner Kay will go talk to Kenny about it.
