

The Board of Commissioners met in regular session with Commissioner Ray McGavran, Commissioner James P Kay, Commissioner Kathy M Luthi, and Mary Arganbright, County Clerk.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman McGavran.

The official minutes of November 1, 2010, were approved and signed.

At 8:00 a.m., the commissioners held a coin toss for the tie write-in position of Concord Township Clerk, between Jim Struble and Randy Gruber. Those present were Jim Struble. Jim called tails, and the flip was tails. However, Jim declined the position.

Commissioner Luthi moved to appoint the following to the vacant positions after no one was elected at the General Election. Bob Flegler, Concord Township Clerk, Dean Catlin, Sherman Township Clerk, and Greg Berndt, Stanton Township Clerk. Commissioner Kay seconded. Motion carried.

Phil Aumick, Economic Development Director, stopped in and asked the commissioners about needing to set-up a monthly meeting with the advisory committee. It was set for November 22, 2010, at 11:00 a.m., in the commissioners room. Phil talked to the board about a meeting in Dodge City, and wondered if the commissioners wanted him to go. The commissioners approved.

Commissioner Kay moved to extend the burn ban another 7 days, and Resolution 10-32, was signed. Commissioner Luthi seconded. Motion carried.

Commissioner Kay moved to appoint Terry Moeckel to the Community Corrections Board. Commissioner Luthi seconded. Motion carried.

Betty Mick, County Attorney, stopped in and discussed legal matters with the commissioners.

John Cople, Highway Administrator, reported on what crews were doing.

Keith Coleman, Sheriff, gave prisoner count of Sedgwick County 42, Ottawa County 2, Saline County 1. Keith said that the 911 equipment is being installed.
